From the Executive Director's Desk November 2025

Dear SON Supporters,

What an amazing year it's been at Star of the North Maternity Home! We have served over 70 Moms & 69 Babies/Children.

Both of our homes have been full—every room filled with the laughter of children, the determination of strong Mothers, and the gentle hum of daily life being rebuilt with love and hope. For more than 14 months, our SON Iron Range home was full with four incredible Moms and their little ones. Now, SON Twin Ports is full, with four Moms and two children—and two more precious babies on the way!

When I say “full,” I don't just mean every bed is taken; I mean our homes are full of purpose, healing, and growth.

Research shows that Moms recovering from trauma need up to 36 months to truly stabilize. On average, our Moms stay about 3–6 months—but when one stays for a year or more, we see something remarkable happen. We see confidence blooming. We see Moms going back to school or finding jobs. We see them learning to organize their calendars, cook, budget, drive, and even buy a car. They're growing in mind, body, and spirit, discovering their unique gifts and finding a sense of direction through life coaching. It's inspiring to watch transformation take place, step by step, day by day.

None of this would be possible without the people who stand behind this mission—our staff who serve with so much heart, our faithful volunteers who show up week after week, and our generous donors and grantors who make sure our doors stay open. You are the hands and feet of this ministry, and your support is changing lives in ways you may never fully see but that we witness every single day.

As we reflect on this season of fullness, my heart is overflowing with gratitude. Thank you for believing in our Moms and their children, for believing in second chances, and for helping create homes where hope truly lives.

Today she is in her 2nd semester of college, pursuing Ojibwe studies, and working part time. Kyra started preschool and part-time daycare in September is acclimating to her new busy schedule, as well. She continues to be smart and spunky! And Marlana, along with Kyra's dad, are doing a great job as her parents, while working on themselves as individuals and as a pair. We are so proud of all of them!

Jessica and Theia were highlighted in May '25 when she shared how she came to us and that she was so grateful for the chance to find her voice as a Mom and strengthen her relationship with her daughter. They were also both looking forward to starting school. All of those things are in full bloom! Jessica and Theia have a strong and confident bond. Theia started preschool in September and loves it! And Jessica has completed certification as a Certified Nursing Assistant. She is also registered for her prerequisites in January to pursue her RN degree. Mom and daughter are both learning and growing so fast!

Finally, we have welcomed two new pregnant Moms in October, and we are so blessed to have them. They each bring their own new energy to the house and are fitting in great. It is fun to see groupings of Moms eat together, laugh, support each other, and get to know each other. Our staff and volunteers feel so lucky to have the families we have and take joy in each of them. We truly are blessed!
